

# INDIANA CLEAN ENERGY JOBS & ECONOMIC IMPACT REPORT



Indiana has benefited considerably from clean energy investments, ranking in the top third of states for solar power and in the top 25% for wind, solar, and energy storage.

With increasing job creation in the clean energy sector and growing capital investment, the Hoosier state is expected to become the 7th leading state for solar generation potential in the next five years.

### **2023 CLEAN ENERGY ANNOUNCEMENTS**



\$8.1B

It's been a good year for Indiana's clean energy economy. With the announcement of 12 new clean energy projects, the state attracted over \$8.1 billion in capital investment that will create more than 5,600 new jobs.

Boosted by strong state-level leadership and the economic development incentives associated with the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) and the Inflation Reduction Act (IRA), Indiana is poised to capitalize on the rapid expansion of the clean energy economy.

#### **Highlights of those new investments include:**

- \$155M investment & 265+ jobs to produce
   Stellantis EV drive modules, Kokomo
- \$35M invested creating 240+ jobs for Bila Solar's U.S. HQ and manufacturing facility, *Indianapolis*
- **300 new jobs** as ReElement Technologies constructs critical mineral refining facility, *Marion*
- **\$102M** Jaewon Industrial chemical recycling plant serving lithium-ion battery manufacturers & the EV supply chain, *Kokomo*
- \$75M investment & 75 new jobs for Soulbrain MI's
   EV battery manufacturing center, Kokomo
- 300 new jobs as Fronius USA plans new solar inverter production lines and data center, *Portage*
